Four years ago, the Lighthouse Uniform Company introduced the Bereavement Uniform Program (BUP) to America's Fire Service.

The intent; make available a dress uniform for burial purposes to any family wanting one, *at no* cost to the family.

The goal; change the collective consciousness of the fire service community regarding who is entitled to a dress uniformed funeral from some to all and provide a way to make it happen.

The hope; strengthen the bond and connection between the incoming and outgoing generation of firefighters and raise the level and manner in which America's Fire Service 'takes care of its own'.

As it turns out, the BUP is a two-step process.

The first step; would the Fire Service support the program has been successfully determined. With an outpouring of generosity from the 'haves', enough uniforms were donated to move forward and all the pieces are in place, the program has been tested, is up, running and available to all.

The second step; getting the program in front of and into the hands of its 'target' audience, the country's smaller and volunteer departments and their retired folks is turning out to be much more difficult. The Lighthouse is not the appropriate messenger and the program needs your help.

The BUP's original tag line, '*Taking care of those who took care of us*' resonated with the donators and worked for step one, but it does not work with the recipient population.

The next step; awareness, acceptance and utilization from the recipient population which will come with the 'messengers' that realize there is a higher, more nuanced level of righteousness available within the BUP than what's on its face.

To help focus the idea, a BUP Video was produced and a new tag line, 'Don't Make Them Ask' and a new **BUP Manual** was developed. The Manual will give you history, perspective and tools to introduce the Bereavement Uniform Program to your department and *in fact, getting a BUP* Manual - Don't Make Them Ask' into every fire department is the most important next step in recognizing and honoring the service of every firefighter.

The BUP Manual – 'Don't Make Them Ask' is available at no charge. To get your department's copy, just email me at steve@lighthouseuniform.com and request one. Don't wait, honoring someone's Grandpa may very well depend on it, and after all, isn't 'taking care of those who took care of us' what 'community' is all about? Don't do it later today. Be a 'messenger'. Do it right now.

NJ&NYVFA Scholarship Application Requirements

Choosing of applicants seems to be getting harder since so many applications are being submitted. In keeping with the ideals of the "New Jersey & New York Volunteer Firemen's Association" (NJ&NYVFA), the following requirements shall be considered when choosing applicants.

All Applicants will have a SPONSOR. No one will nominate himself or herself.

The SPONSOR shall be a member in good standing (dues fully paid). This SPONSOR must be a Personal or Life member of the New Jersey & New York Volunteer Firemen's Association ...not just a delegate.

First Preference:

>To an Active dues paying member or Life member of the NJ&NYVFA. >A Child or Grandchild of any Active dues paying member or Life member. Applications may be Graduating High School Seniors or in College. Applications should be active in their respective municipalities Emergence Service Organizations. This can include Junior FD Responders, Probationary Firefighters, Rescue Squad/EMT (EMS) or Active Firefighters in their municipalities.

Second Preference:

>High School Seniors that are graduating and going to college, or may already be College students. (These students are children/grandchildren of NJ&NYVFA members and are NOT in any FD related organizations).

Third Preference:

> Applicants who are graduating High School or are already in college and suffer extreme financial hardships outside their control.

The applicant who plans to pursue a degree that will make the fire service better shall be considered.

Each applicant shall be considered on its own merit and hardship. There shall be no precedent

It is highly suggested that Applicants shall be pursuing degrees in Fire Science, Nursing/ Medicine, Crime Scene Forensics (CSI) Criminal Justice or Law. (the thought is to make the fire service & fire service family better)

The Scholarship Committee will meet and discuss all applicants, their respective applications and take each application on its own merit. The Scholarship Committee will have a report ready for the Executive Board prior to the June convention. If the Committee cannot reach a decision, the President will have final say on any application.

AN APPLICANT MUST BE ENROLLED IN OR PLANNING TO ENROLL IN THE NEXT SCHEDULED SEMESTER OF A TWO (2) OR FOUR (4) YEAR ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.

ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE POSTMARKED NOT LATER THAN APRIL 20TH.

It is taking an obsolete ski lift cable and giving it a second life as hand railing in a luxury condo building.
